## REQUIREMENTS FOR THE PSYCHOLOGY MINOR

1. Students must complete PSY 1000, General Psychology (3 credits), plus six additional courses, worth an additional 18 credits. So PSY 1000 + 18 credits = 21 credits.
2. All courses must be completed with a grade of C or higher.
3. At least half of the courses must be taken at Kean University.
4. In selecting the six courses, there must be one course from at least three of our five categories/areas. Those five categories/areas are: 1- Developmental Psychology, 2- Theoretical Foundations, 3- Applied Areas, 4- Social and Interpersonal Approaches, and 5- Mind/Brain
5. Fill out and e-mail the Change of Undergraduate Major/Minor form to the Psychology Minor Advisor, who will review and sign it and then send it to the Registrar's Office, along with an e-mailed confirmation to the student. You may request a blank copy of this form from the Psychology Minor Advisor or from the Psychology Department or from the Registrar's Office.

## ADVISEMENT FOR THE PSYCHOLOGY MINOR

You should be guided in selecting your courses by the information above and on the second page of this Guide Sheet, which lists the Psychology courses in each category/area.

You do **not** need to have any hold lifted by the Psychology Minor Advisor in order to register for your Psychology Minor courses. However, you are encouraged to check in by email or in person with the Psychology Minor advisor once a year.

### **To request advisement you should send an email to the Psychology Minor Advisor that includes the following:**

1. Indicate which courses you have already taken on the second page and the grades you received. Write "TE" to indicate if a course was taken at another institution ("TE" means "Transfer Equivalent" credits.)
2. Indicate any courses you are currently taking, by writing the semester, for example, Spring 2021
3. Indicate any course you are planning to take by putting a checkmark in the "Grade or Projected Semester" column.
4. Include your Student ID in your email, and in the subject line put "Psychology Minor Advisement request".
5. Save and e-mail this document to the Psychology Minor advisor, please use your KEAN Email, who will review it and will let you know if the courses you have selected would fulfill the requirements for the Psychology Minor.

**FOR GRADUATION:** The semester before or early in the semester you are graduating, e-mail the Psychology Minor advisor with an updated list of the courses you have taken—with the grades -- and the courses you are currently taking (IP \_\_\_\_ Semester) or will be taking in the last semester (Semester \_\_\_\_). *Always include your Student ID* in any emails to the Psychology Minor Advisor, and the words Psychology Minor Advisement in the subject line.
